AR126 RAPE AND SEXUAL ASSAULT: A VICTIM-CENTRED APPROACH

Victims of rape and sexual assault may also be unfortunate enough to encounter disbelief and 'victim blaming' from those who think they 'asked for it', for example, by behaving or dressing in a certain way.

This course addresses those misconceptions and considers a new approach for health professionals involved in their care, which incorporates the psychological, physical and forensic issues arising when caring for these patients. Confidentiality, consent and police involvement are closely examined with consideration to the legal and ethical tenets before identifying clear referral pathways.
